05.01.10 INTEREST RATE AND DISCOUNT ON THE PAYMENT OF TAXES

Considering that as per the provisions of Article 981 of the Quebec Municipal Code, Council must decree the applicable interest rate for debts;

Considering Council adopted a by-law allocating a discount for the advance payment of taxes as per Article 1007 of the Municipal Code;

Considering that as per Article 250.1, the Municipality may decree that a penalty be added to the amount of municipal taxes payable;

It is proposed by Councillor Jean Dutil And unanimously resolved:

That Council decree the following rates until further notice;

Interest rate: 12 % Penalty: 5% Discount: 2%

06.01.10 ADOPTION OF BY-LAW 466 REGARDING THE TERMS OF PAYMENT OF REAL ESTATE TAXES AND COMPENSATIONS

Council members renounce to the reading of By-law 466 regarding the terms of payment of real estate taxes and compensations and the Assistant Secretary-treasurer gives a summary.

It is proposed by Councillor Claude Philippe Lemire And unanimously resolved:

That Council adopt By-law 466 as follows:

BY-LAW 466 REGARDING THE TERMS OF PAYMENT OF REAL ESTATE TAXES AND COMPENSATIONS

WHEREAS the Municipality, as per Article 252 of the Municipal Taxation Act L.R.Q., c F-2.1, has the regulatory authority to bring certain modifications to the method of payment of real estate taxes, services and compensations, in accordance to the Law;

WHEREAS that as per Article 1007 of the Quebec municipal Code, L.R.Q., c. C-27, the Municipality may allocate a discount for the payment of taxes;

WHEREAS a notice of motion was given by Councillor Claude P. Lemire with the exemption of its reading at the regular Council meeting of December 9th, 2009;

CONSEQUENTLY, the following is decreed by the present by-law subject to the approvals required by Law:

ARTICLE 1

The preamble forms an integral part of the present by-law.

ARTICLE 2

The real estate taxes, services and compensations must be paid in one instalment.

However, when the total real estate tax is equal or superior to \$ 300, the debtor may chose to make the payment in four equal instalments.

ARTICLE 3

One instalment or the first instalment of municipal taxes must be made by the latest, on the thirtieth day following the mailing of the account.

The second instalment must be made by the latest, on the seventieth day following the thirtieth day of the mailing of the account.

The third instalment must be made by the latest, on the seventieth day from the limit given to make the second instalment.

The fourth instalment must be made by the latest, on the seventieth day from the limit given to make the third instalment.

ARTICLE 4

Only the regulations pertaining to one instalment apply if a tax is levied pursuant to an additional budget.

ARTICLE 5

When an instalment is not made within the specified period, the balance becomes payable immediately.

ARTICLE 6

A discount established by resolution is granted to any person who pays their property taxes in full, when they are equal or more than \$ 300, by the latest, the thirtieth day pursuant to the mailing of the account.

ARTICLE 7

The present by-law rescinds By-law 320 for all intents and purposes.

ARTICLE 8

The present by-law will enter into effect as per the Law.

08.01.10 MUNICIPAL TAXE ON TELEPHONE SERVICES FOR THE FINANCING OF 911 EMERGENCY CENTERS

Whereas, in accordance to Articles 244.73 and 244.74 of the Municipal taxation Act, the Agence municipale de financement et de développement des centres d'urgence 911 du Québec was created and must remit to local municipalities for the purpose of financing 911 emergency centers, the tax levied on telephone services;

Whereas the Municipality would like the Agency to directly pay the organization that offers the 911 emergency services as it becomes possible;

It is proposed by Councillor Jean Dutil And unanimously resolved:

That the Municipality ask the Agence municipale de financement et de développement des centres d'urgence 911 du Québec to pay, as soon as possible, the Centre d'appel d'urgence Chaudière-Appalaches-Cauca, whose head office is located at 485, boul. Renault, C.P. 5128, Beauceville, Québec, G5X 3P5 for and in the Municipality's name, all allowances of the levied tax as per Article 244.68 of the Municipal taxation Act which are owed, which has a full discharge payment for the Agency for the Municipality as long as is not notified at least 60 days before any change is made to the addressee, to be charged for the Agency to report to the Municipality, the amounts to be paid.

That all pertinent costs to this transaction be paid for by Les Stations de la Vallée de Saint-Sauveur Inc.
