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### News from the Mayor

Fellow citizens,

Let me begin by wishing you all an amazing summer!

Here is a brief overview of our winter activities. Our cross-country ski season broke all records this year with sales of over 1,000 season passes and more than 5,000 daily tickets. This testifies to the quality of our trails and the enthusiasm that our citizens have for the great outdoors. Our partnership with Les Fondeurs Laurentides, Sommet Morin Heights and the Caisses Desjardins resulted in the construction of a high-level training trail. This was so successful that, in March, we had the honor of hosting the Quebec Cross-Country Ski Cup. This was the first time since 1983 that a cross-country ski competition came back home and this is just the beginning! The FIS-Ski (International Ski Federation) certification process is well underway and we hope to be able to hold a national level competition in the near future!

The renovation of the Bellevue Chalet is progressing well and the opening is scheduled for the last week of August. We will invite the population to an opening event in order for them to discover our new community space. The funding from the Canada-Quebec joint Small Communities Fund has financed two-thirds of the conversion of the building into a community centre.

The cycling link between Saint-Sauveur and Morin-Heights, Vélocité, will be finalized this summer with the installation of a footbridge over the Rivière-à-Simon near the Alila Hotel. The *P'tit Train du Nord* and the



Aerobic Corridor will then be connected and cyclists will be able to enjoy these two jewels of the Laurentians.

This summer, there will be work done to replace the aqueduct, the sidewalks and the causeway on chemin du Village between Carver and Grand-Orme streets. This work is 50% subsidized by the excise gasoline tax. We ask that you please be patient during this period.

I invite you to come and enjoy the many summer activities that we have to offer you such as Canada Day, the annual Arts Morin-Heights summer exhibition, Shakespearein-the-Park, FC Morin-Heights matches, the Royal Canadian Legion baseball games and the Club des Pays-d'en-Haut's mountain bike races.

We live in a beautiful community with volunteers who work hard in a myriad of areas. I invite you to join them and thus you will surely enjoy many beautiful human experiences!

### **Collective** Garden

Our little group has met and mulled over the various phases this project has been through already. There has been much success as well as many unexpected turns and results. One success is the land behind the municipal library dedicated to an edible forest – that is growing more evident with each season. This space has a number of fruiting trees and plants as well as a wide variety of medicinal herbs, perfect for a bit of exploring with the family!

The school garden has also been progressing. Last year, we added some straw bales - one for each class, including the La Rochelle pre-school. Now in its third year, a quarter of the garden will be planted by the older students so that they have a sense of what it is like to plant directly into the ground. They will have some planning to do! What plants like to be together? Which should stay far from each other and why? Hmmm, there's more to it than just plunking a seed into the earth! And the idea of opening up the possibility for the students to do some learning outside of classrooms?! Incredible!

The teachers' efforts have resulted in Staples awarding \$25,000 in tech tools to empower the school and to reward its Wild Program. Morin-Heights Elementary School was one of ten throughout Canada to have received this grant!

The growing has extended to other locations. Mickey's Café owner, Yvon Gilbert, opened up the pony Benny's old grazing area, planting and harvesting a sizeable quantity of produce for the food bank last season. He is looking for helping hands for this season:

### Mountain Bike Network

A reminder that a work bee will be held on Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup> to work on the new trails in the park. New trail development will be ongoing throughout the summer so please respect any signage. A new trail map will be issued as soon as possible.

A reminder to also respect the 24 hour rain rule: please do not ride on the trails for 24 hours after a heavy rain. Also, please report any major trail damage or fallen trees to 450 226-3232, ext. 131.

Le Club Vélo Pays-d'en-Haut will be hosting three races this summer on June 17<sup>th</sup>, July 12<sup>th</sup> (in the evening) and August 12<sup>th</sup>. The course will be closed during the morning while the races are underway.



### **Public Works**

#### **Road and Traffic Signs**

Over the summer, various construction sites will be opened for road repairs on our territory, and temporary signs will be installed (i.e. temporary traffic lights). You are required to respect temporary signs the same way you would permanent ones: rules and penalties imposed by the Highway Safety Code apply just the same.

When a site is delimited, please respect the security perimeter and avoid distracting workers and flagmen. They are there to do a job and keep their eyes on traffic to ensure your safety. Be vigilant!

#### Ditches

Please remember that green clippings and other materials cannot be dumped or left in ditches; their main function is to capture the run-off water. Contact the municipal ecocentre to verify what they will accept.

#### Watering lawns, hedges, trees, shrubs, flower beds and vegetable gardens:

Watering is authorized from May 20 <sup>th</sup> to September 10 <sup>th</sup>			
<b>Manual</b> watering with a hose or portable sprinkler: <b>EVEN</b> civic numbers	Monday & Wednesday between 20:00 and 23:00		
Manual watering with a hose or portable sprinkler: ODD civic numbers	Tuesday & Thursday, between 20:00 and 23:00		
<b>Automatic</b> sprinkler systems, <b>EVEN</b> civic numbers	Program for one hour a day maximum: Monday & Wednesday between 23:00 and 1:00		
<b>Automatic</b> sprinkler systems, <b>ODD</b> civic numbers	Program for one hour a day maximum: Tuesday & Thursday between 23:00 and 1:00		

Exception for new lawns: an authorization from the Town Planning and Environment Department may be obtained.

Make a difference: conserve water for future generations.

### Morin-Heights Fire Department and First Responders

Did you know that in Québec, nearly 200 000 families and individuals move on July 1<sup>st</sup> every year? So much action packed into one day! Here are some safety tips to consider when you move into your new home:

#### Check your smoke alarms:

- Put a new battery in each smoke alarm as soon as you move in (except for lithium battery alarms);
- Check the manufacturing date on the outer casing of every appliance. Replace it or have it replaced by the owner if it is more than ten years old;
- Make sure there is at least one smoke alarm on each floor of the home and that it is located in the hallway, near the bedrooms. For even greater safety, we recommend that you install a smoke detector inside each bedroom, in accordance with the new building requirements currently in effect in Quebec;
- Test your smoke alarms by exposing them to the smoke produced by blowing out a candle. If it does not sound, replace it or have it replaced by the owner.

#### Check the carbon monoxide (CO) alarms:

- Ensure that there is at least one CO alarm in the home if you have a combustion appliance (e.g. using oil or propane or wood), storing combustion tools within the home, or if you have an attached garage. In order to ensure its audibility, it is recommended that you install a carbon monoxide alarm per floor where there are bedrooms;
- Follow the manufacturer's installation instructions. The detector can be installed at any height on the wall since CO spreads relatively evenly into the atmosphere.

#### Preparation of an evacuation plan:

Municipal Services

- Prepare an evacuation plan with all occupants of the home and test it.
- Determine a gathering point with all family members, at the front of the house, if possible, near the entrance is ideal;
- Plan ahead for the evacuation of children, the elderly or disabled, and pets;
- If you live in a multi-unit building, read the evacuation plan for the building and locate the emergency exits.

#### Heating and electricity:

- Have the chimney and heaters inspected as soon as you are installed in your new home;
- Have the chimney swept as soon as you arrive. Do not wait until autumn, because the humid summer air combined with the creosote deposits causes corrosion of the chimney's steel parts and promotes corking;
- Wood for burning should be stored at a distance from the house and only small quantities at a time should be brought into the house. Wood is a highly combustible material as well as being a source of moisture and vermin;
- Have the electric panel inspected by a master electrician.

When moving, avoid stacking boxes and other objects in corridors, on balconies, terraces, underneath the windows outside and along the house. Their presence can complicate or even prevent an evacuation in the case of an emergency. When arriving in a new municipality, be aware of municipal regulations, such as those governing outdoor fires and fireworks.
