The Mayor's Report on the Financial Situation

November 12th, 2011

My fellow citizens,

In compliance with the Quebec Municipal Code, I would like to present the report on the Municipality's financial situation to December 31st, 2010.

I invite you to consult the financial documents, specifically, the Financial report and the Performance indicators which are presented annually to the Minister of Municipal Affairs, Regions and Land Occupancy at www.morinheights.com.

The financial report for the year ending on December 31st, 2010, prepared by Richard Deslauriers C.A., auditor, presents the results on page 3.

The year 2010

The Municipality is in a sound financial state and management indicators, presented last August, confirm its efficiency. In 2010, the real estate value has increased to \$713,606,400.

In 2010, the Municipality has invested major funds into the improvement of roadwork along with the reconstruction work to the Beaulieu drinking water network.

Now that the work on the improvement of the six municipal drinking water networks has been completed, the administration must concentrate on updating the conduits which have reached their life span.

The administration has entered into an agreement with its unionized employees with the signature of a five-year (2010-2014) contract which will benefit both parties.

The enthusiastic participation of the citizens' associations living on waterfront properties has allowed for the consolidation of the protection of shoreline program which will, in the long term, ensure the quality of water.

As the intermunicipal ecocentre's popularity is on the rise, the acceptance of domestic dangerous products along with the increase in the use of garbage and recycling bins have concluded in the positive effect on the roadside cleanliness.

The year 2011

As we approach the end of the year, we intend to complete the year with a slight surplus. The housing development remains on the rise. The evaluation role has increased over the last nine months by 2.5%.



Council adopted a remuneration policy for management and non-unionized employees aimed at keeping key people within the organization.

This year, Council invested major amounts into the roads network. Other than work as per the current budget, specifically, on Christieville, Village, Rang 4 and Grand Orme Roads, Council invested a large amount of the surplus into the reconstruction of Lakeshore and Campbell Roads. Finally, the work on Kirkpatrick Road was done thanks to amounts collected from the sandpit over the past two years.

The improvement to the roads network is a priority for Council and during the preparation of the 2012 budget, objectives will be found in order to provide for the project.

Phase I of the Lummis Park project has been completed because of the funds made available in the Parks and Playground Fund.

Also, the reconstruction work on the Alpino drinking water network have been completed and the Public works department will begin work on the Bastien network.

The protection of the environment remains one of the Administration's major concerns. Recently, first notices have been sent out to property owners who have not yet had their septic tanks emptied and the Town Planning and Environment departments will ensure a follow-up.

2012 budget

Over the next few weeks, management employees and Council will be preparing the 2012 budgetary forecasts. The work will be planned and prioritized. Results of this work will be made public at the special budget meeting on December 14th.



As stipulated by Law, I am presenting to Council the list of suppliers whose transactions exceeded \$25,000 during the current year. This information is also available on our website.

Finally, here is the Council members' remuneration:

The Mayor's annual income is \$21,078.01 with an additional \$9,265.57 for acting as the Municipality's representative on the MRC's board composed of all regional mayors.

A Councillor's annual income is \$6,888.24 to which is added the amount of \$115.02 per month for the Councillor acting as Pro-mayor and \$62.75 per month for Councillors presiding over various Council Committees.

In addition to this compensation, Councillors have a right to a non-taxable expense allowance equal to half their annual income.

I would like to thank the Council members and all Municipal employees for their concerted and continued effort to provide the Municipality of Morin-Heights with modern infrastructures while respecting taxpayers' ability to pay.

In Council's name, I would like to thank all of the municipal employees and volunteers who dedicate their time for the well-being of the community.

Important notice

For your own safety, make sure your civic number is visible from the road, 24 hours a day, summer through winter, in order to allow emergency services to find you quickly. In case of an emergency, every second counts!

Please note that there is a by-law concerning the visibility of your civic number. Not conforming can result in a fine.

Parking Prohibited

Parking is prohibited at all times on public roads throughout the territory and can be sanctioned by a fine or your vehicule can be towed. A section of Village Road (west side) offers some authorized parking spaces and so does a section of Campbell Street (east side), between Village and Glen, but only between 8:00 and 22:00 on both.

Please respect the by-law.

Maximum driving speed standardized

Since September 2010, all streets and residential roads

Public Works

Parking and snow removal

Snow removal is Public Works' main responsibility in wintertime. The speed and efficiency of snow clearing operations are greatly improved with the cooperation of all citizens. Here are a few important points to remember:

• Parking is prohibited on all public roads at all times with the exception of certain spots on Village and Campbell Roads, only from 8:00 to 22:00.

• <u>Citizens must avoid</u> installing lights, mailboxes, fences, hedges, retaining walls or erect any structure <u>between their lot line and the edge of the road in winter</u>. This space is municipal property reserved for snow removal operations and the Municipality is not responsible for damages occurring in that space.

Note: Hedges should be planted one meter within front setbacks and protected. It is very important to remove all debris and obstructions from road ditches to ensure proper flow of surface waters when the snow melts.

• It is important to use **non-metallic** property markers or reflectors to avoid damage to municipal equipment. Opt for fibreglass or wooden ones and <u>install them at the limits of your</u> <u>property</u>, <u>rather that at the edge of the driveway</u>.

• It is illegal to shovel or plough snow from your roof, driveway or car onto municipal roads, sidewalks and in front of fire-hydrants.

Please note that by-law 401, available online, exists and allows snow blowing on private property.

Your cooperation is of essence.

The sand we spread on roads, mixed with 3% salt, is generally only applied once the snow has stopped falling, salt is ineffective below -15°C. The combination sand/salt is more efficient and easier on the environment.

Emergency exits in winter

In the event of a fire, a house can become a trap as many obstacles, indoor or outdoor, can prevent your family from getting out to safety. Snow accumulations blocking your secondary exits (balconies, patios, access paths, etc.) can also hinder a fast evacuation. Owners of propane heaters should make sure that the vent is free of snow and that the manufacturer's minimal clearing is respected. See to it!

VEDER Ventilation Systems

Venmar has released an important notice concerning their ventilation systems manufactured between 1983 and 2001 or between October 2006 and August 2007. An unlikely series of circumstances could lead to a motor overheating, which may result in a potential fire hazard.

Carbon Monoxide

A smoke detector does not detect carbon monoxide (CO): a CO detector is therefore also needed. After visiting many homes to check smoke detectors, we found out that 80% of people have a secondary heating source: a fireplace, a slow burning wood stove or a propane heater, and that 90% of these homes are not equipped with carbon monoxide detector(s). These inexpensive devices save lives.

Fire burns, smoke kills

Did you know that smoke is more likely to be deadly than fire itself? A smoke detector is still the cheapest and easiest device to install and maintain to alert residents of the presence of smoke at the start of a fire, even before flames are visible. Since it was marketed in the early 80's, the smoke detector has helped reduce the average number of firerelated deaths from 180 to 70 each year.

According to the regulation in force in Morin-Heights, all residences must have smoke alarms. In accordance with the new standards CNB 2010 and CNPI 2010, it is recommended to install a smoke detector (ULC approved) in each bedroom where people sleep with the door closed, in each hallway near bedrooms, near staircases and on each floor, including the basement. These safety tips apply for main residences as well as cottages/cabins. A smoke detector with a long-lasting lithium battery is a good choice; the battery, located in a sealed compartment, has a lifetime of ten years.

Two easy steps to verify your batteryoperated or electric smoke detectors:

• Verify the battery **once a month** using the test button. You should hear the signal immediately. If they are connected to a surveillance center, let them know you will test them and follow instructions.

• Test the detector with smoke **once a year.** In a safe container, burn incense, a cotton string or blow out a candle under the detector. You'll be able to check if it works. With time, corrosion, dust and grease can prevent it from working properly.

Preparing a home escape plan: child's play!

An evacuation plan is a drawing of each floor of your home that simplifies the evacuation of your residence to increase your chances of survival in case of a fire. All occupants must be familiar with the evacuation plan and it must be practiced at least once a year. A few safety procedures can also accompany your plan. Here are the necessary tools to make your own.

The plan should identify:

- all possible exit paths from each room leading outside;
- all windows and doors that can serve as exits, ideally two per room;
- the location of smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors, as well as portable extinguishers;
- a meeting point outside, usually at the front of the house;
- how and where to contact 9-1-1.


Remember to:

- crawl on all fours under smoke;
- once you reach the meeting point, count heads to see if you have everyone;
- exit the building before dialing 9-1-1;
- never go back inside the building.
