News from the Mayor

Fellow citizens,

There are many great projects underway in our Municipality! Here is a brief overview.

We have acquired and protected 60 acres of land between Route 364 and the Aerobic

Corridor, commonly known as *Castel Marie*. This magnificent land and its seven buildings will undeniably benefit all citizens. A public consultation on their future uses will take place during winter.

We have also acquired 30 acres of land between Chalet Bellevue and Simon River, and the building housing Basler Enterprises. This purchase will enable us to protect cross-country ski trails on flat land and will serve as the future site of our wastewater treatment plant. A greening and redevelopment plan for Basler Park, including the parking lot, will also be implemented since we now own the entire site.

At the time of writing, the construction of the Habitat Morin-Heights project (30 housing units for people aged 75 and over behind Chalet Bellevue) should begin shortly. These are the results of five years of sustained efforts to keep our seniors in the community. Congratulations to everyone involved in this project!

The library renovation is now complete, and we invite you to discover our improved facilities. You can also take the opportunity to become a member and thank all the volunteers who have dedicated time and effort for so many years.

Lighting on chemin du Village and chemin du Lac-Écho has also been completed, and the results will give these roads an interesting cachet. This work marks the beginning of several phases in our plan to improve the village. A grant of over \$650,000 has been obtained to reduce the cost to taxpayers.

In closing, I encourage you to use our cross-country skiing, nordic hiking and snowshoeing trails, sliding hills, and skating rinks. We are fortunate to live in a community that offers great winter activities, so let's make the most of it!

New for This Year!

Cross-country skiing, snowshoeing and fat bike passes will no longer be offered as disposable season passes, as they will be replaced by membership cards (citizen card for Morin-Heights residents) to help preserve our environment. Seasonal passes will be purchased online, and your subscription will be automatically linked to your membership card.

We are also continuing to document the usage frequencies of the different recreational activities we offer throughout our territory. Therefore, when you arrive in any of our parks or when our patrol passes you on the trail, we will ask you to show us your membership card and specify the activity you carried out. By doing so, we will obtain a more precise statistical breakdown of the activities in which people participate, helping us further improve our services.

Public Works

The Municipality is seeking the population's cooperation to respect the municipal instructions and regulations for the winter period and thus allow our snowplows to intervene quickly and effectively this winter.

Streets Snow Removal

Snow removal and the spreading of abrasive are the main activities of the Public Works Department during winter. The speed of execution of these activities improves safety on our streets. For this reason, we remind you that when removing snow from driveways, parking lots and pedestrian walkways, you must deposit snow on your private land and not on the Municipality's land to not interfere with snow removal operations. It is your responsibility to notify your private contractor. Anyone who contravenes this by-law is liable to a minimum fine of \$100 for a first offence (By-law 569 2019). Remember that parking is prohibited on all public roads, under the penalty of a fine and the risk of being towed at your expense.

Sanding

The mixture spread on the roads is made of sand to which 5% of salt is added and is generally applied once the snow has stopped falling. This mixture is more efficient and easier on the environment than salt alone, as salt is efficient only when temperatures range between 0°C and -15°C.

Courtesy and Respect

During snow removal operations, we invite you to show courtesy by giving way to snow removal vehicles so that they can perform safe maneuvers during their various operations. During a loading operation, you should never overtake the convoy of trucks unless a flag person gives you permission to do so. Likewise, compliance with the flaggers' instructions is always essential during detours since the objective remains to accelerate all snow removal activities, allowing users to regain full access to the public highway in the areas as fast as possible.

Sidewalks Snow Removal

Snow removal on sidewalks and widening of roads is done with various vehicles and a snowblower. By-law 401 (available online) allows snow blowing on private properties.

Temporary Winter Shelters and Property Markers

Be sure to set up your temporary winter shelter and markers on your property. The structures and markers installed in the street right-of-way interfere with snow removal operations and slow down the work of operators. Use wood or fibreglass poles since metal poles can damage snow removal equipment, causing significant costs and delaying work. In addition, if breakages are caused to structures located within the municipal right-of-way, the Municipality cannot be held responsible for the damage because it is the citizens' responsibility to respect this area.

Private Property

Whether there is a fence, a hedge or a flower bed in front of your property, it is important to protect it in the fall. Note that the first metre within your property line, not from the curb or the ditch, must remain free of any installations or structures. This clearance is required primarily for snow removal operations. This principle also applies to garbage, recycling, and compost bins.

All owners remain responsible for their landscaping installations bordering a road, and the Municipality will not accept any liability claims for damages incurred to these structures or plants.

Curbside Collection

At all times, it is important to place the bins at the curb only on collection day; extra care must be taken in the winter.

In winter, your cooperation is key regarding the collection and snow removal operations. Your bin must be placed in your driveway at no more than 1.5 metres from the road to avoid being knocked over by the snowplow. **Fallen bins cannot be emptied.**

The Town Planning and Environment Department reminds you that outdoor storage of firewood, recreational vehicles and household trailers is authorized in the rear and side yards of a property previously occupied by a primarily residential building.


Septic Tank

As snow is a good insulator, we suggest you keep it on your septic tank covers during the winter.

We also want to remind you that it is mandatory to empty your septic tank every two years for permanent residences and every four years for secondary residences. You must provide proof of emptying by sending an invoice to the Town Planning and Environment Department.

Wheeled Bins Storage

Wheeled bins may be placed at the curbside of your driveway from 17:00 on the day before collection day, and must be removed by 21:00 on collection day. No bins may be left at the curb outside these hours.

Preventing Fire Hazards When Decorating for the Christmas Holidays

Remember the following prevention tips for a safe decorating season as the festive season approaches.

Christmas Tree

Choose an artificial tree, as it is less likely to catch fire than a natural one.

If you choose a natural tree:

- choose a freshly cut tree with needles that do not shed easily;
- bevel the trunk and place it in a container filled with water;
- · water it daily;
- place the tree more than 1 metre from all heat sources (electric plinths, heaters, fireplaces, etc.);
- unplug the Christmas lights when the tree begins to dry out.

Decorative Lights

- Choose lights certified by а recognized organization such as the CSA or ULC.
- Choose low-heat-emitting bulbs such as LEDs.
- Examine your lights before installing them, and discard any defective, desiccated, or cracked ones.
- Make sure your replacement bulbs have the same voltage as your old ones.
- Avoid putting indoor-use decorative lights outdoors, or vice versa.
- Plug all outdoor items into a ground-fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) socket.
- Never overload the electrical system.
- Always use a timer or turn off your decorative lights when you leave the house or go to bed.
- After the festive season, bring outdoor lights inside to prevent damage from the sun and weather. Decorative lights are not designed for long-term use.

Extension Cord

- If you must use extension cords, choose those approved by a recognized organization such as CSA or ULC.
- Avoid too long cords that need to be coiled, as the cable may overheat and cause arcing.
- If you must use an extension cord for your outdoor decorations, ensure it is designed for outdoor use.
- Do not overload outlets and extension cords. Use a power strip instead.
- Do not hide your extension cords under rugs or carpets.
 The weight of people walking on them and the friction they cause can damage the cable and increase the risk of fire.
- Do not leave an extension cord in a doorway. The cable's insulation could be damaged if the door closes on it.
- Use only one extension cord at a time. Do not connect extension cords end to end.

- -> Have you thought about changing the batteries in you smoke detectors when you set your clocks back?
- -> Don't forget to have your chimney swept!

Civic Address

To facilitate emergency response, ensure your civic address (house number) is always clearly visible from the public road.

A snow-cleared civic address also helps us help you more quickly when you dial 9-1-1.

Conditions and Trails Opening: Do you want to know the latest conditions? Visit morinheights.com/ Outdoors. It is updated daily and shows the date of the last mechanical service.

Certain weather conditions prevent the use of trails to preserve their quality or restoration. Please respect these guidelines when these notices are issued. Furthermore, some trail routes may be modified. Please respect all signs and private property.

Ski school: It will be possible to take a cross-country ski initiation lesson or to master specific techniques! Equipment rental is available. By reservation at 450 226-3232, ext. 132. The site for the ski lessons is located at 185 rue Bennett.

Equipment Rental:

Cross-country skiing and skating: The rentals are located at 50 chemin du Lac-Écho (Aerobic Corridor Pavilion). For the skating equipment, the rentals are located at 185 rue Bennett.

Snowshoeing: The rentals are located at Basler Park's parking booth at 99 chemin du Lac-Écho.

Dogs Reminder: Dogs are allowed on snowshoe trails only and must be on a leash. You may also walk your dog at the Canine Corridor on chemin du Midi or at the dog park located at 100 chemin du Lac-Écho.





Youth Sports Program Reimbursement Policy

The Municipality of Morin-Heights reimburses the difference between the resident and non-resident registration fees, up to a maximum of \$200 per child, per activity, per year, for activities offered within a junior ice hockey, baseball, figure skating or swimming club.

A town in the Laurentians must be the activities' organizer, and reimbursement is available only to youngsters aged 17 and under who are permanent residents of Morin-Heights.

Requests for reimbursement must be submitted no later than sixty (60) days following the activity start date. Refunds will be issued at the end of the season or session.
